

### The Voting Rights Act of 1965

The Voting Rights Act of 1965, was signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson on August 5th, 1965 during the civil rights movement. It eliminated various devices, such as literacy tests, that had traditionally been used as discriminatory barriers to restrict black people from exercising their 15 Amendment right to vote. It also gave congress the power to enforce this act.

### Judiciary Act of 1789

The judiciary act of 1789 was a United States statute that was adopted in the very first session of the US Congress, that established the federal judiciary of the United States. The Federal Judiciary being one of the 3 branches of the US government, which ensures that the government is not only checked, but balanced. The act set the number of Supreme Court justices as six, one of which being the “Chief Justice”

Judiciary Act was also considered unconstitutional under section 13 as it staked a claim to grow the original jurisdiction of the Supreme Court beyond what the Constitution established and permitted. It was the first partially invalidated act by Congress

### Federal Election Campaign Act of 1974

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 is the primary United States federal law regulating political campaign spending and fundraising. The law originally focused on increased disclosure of contributions for federal campaigns. FEC provided public financing for presidential primaries and general elections, limited presidential campaign spending, required disclosure, and attempted to limit contributions. Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) also introduced outright bans on certain corporate and union contributions, speech, and expenditures.
